# Kent Minerals and Waste Local Pan 2024-39 Pre-Submission Draft (Regulation 19) Consultation

Thank you for inviting National Highways (NH) to comment on the Kent Minerals and Waste Local Plan 2024-39 Pre-Submission Draft (Regulation 19) (January 2024), seeking a response by no later than midnight on 29 February 2024.

We have read the 'Guidance Notes on Making a Representation'. We understand that comments are sought on the Pre-Submission Draft Kent Minerals and Waste Local Plan 2024-39 (the Plan), with the focus being on the proposed revisions to the adopted Plan. This Plan includes the overarching strategy and planning policies for mineral extraction, importation and recycling, and the waste management of all waste streams that are generated or managed in Kent. Site allocations are covered in other documents.

We also understand that the purpose of the public consultation is to invite comments on the Plan's 'legal compliance' (including the Duty to Co-operate) and 'soundness' prior to submission to the Secretary of State.

## Policy Context

NH is the company responsible for the Strategic Road Network (SRN), with our focus being on its safety, reliability, and operational efficiency.



The policy of the Secretary of State for Transport in relation to the SRN **is Circular 01/2022:** <u>Strategic road network and the delivery of sustainable development</u>. In responding to this consultation, NH has taken Circular 1/2022 as relevant national policy.

In addition, the policy context for our response includes the Government's <u>National</u> <u>Planning Policy Framework</u> (NPPF) (December 2023).

NH has recently updated its '<u>Planning Guide</u>' (October 2023) which sets out how the company engages with the planning system, including plan-making. This was updated in the context of 01/2022.

In terms of plan-making, our engagement is focused on exploring opportunities to reduce the reliance on the SRN for local journeys including a reduction in the need to travel and maximising opportunities for walking, wheeling, cycling, public transport and shared travel.

Our response is focused on the soundness of the Plan, in particular compliance with the 'Consistent with national policy' test. We have also provided a response in respect of the Duty to Co-operate, being one of the prescribed bodies.



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#### National Highways' Response

Table 1 (below) sets out National Highways' representations on the Plan, with reference to legal compliance and the soundness tests.

NH004	Policy DM 13: Transportation of Minerals and Waste	Soundness: Consistent with National Policy test	Section 2 of the policy should state: " <b>safely</b> accommodate the traffic flows" that would be generated to be consistent with the expectations of national policy (01/2022).
