Notifying The Secretary Of State Of Our Objection To A Compulsory Purchase Order

We give formal notification of our objection to aspects of the Kent County Council (A28 Sturry Link Road) Compulsory Purchase Order 2023.

We own/occupy the most significantly impacted property: Perryfield Farm.

The initial CPO documents were received effectively from John Farmer in a letter dated 29 November 2023. This response has been sent (by Special Delivery post) principally to comply with the stipulated 22 December 2023 deadline for objections.

Throughout we have been flexible in accommodating the Sturry Link Road scheme. Our objections relate to reasonably minor adjustments that KCC can accommodate but disregard with a mind-set of 'WE' Goliath are more powerful than 'YOU' David.

Our justifiable objections fall within the scope of conventional 'grounds of objection'. Briefly, they are associated with the following issues:

- Failure to follow normally and morally expected procedures
- Attempting to acquire more land than is strictly necessary - without justification
- Detrimental impact on our human rights with regards to privacy/safety/security
- Overall scheme funding and uncertainty

We request allowance is made for presenting a more detailed 'statement of case' when the CPO is dealt with by Inquiry or Written Representations Procedure.
